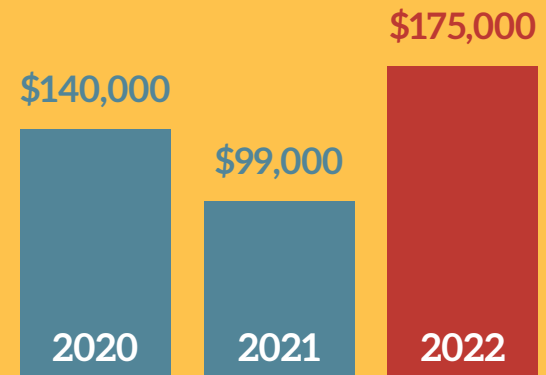
Each year, Trigon gives a portion of our revenues back to the communities that we are proudly a part of, supporting a diverse range of projects and initiatives that, in turn, improve the quality of life in the communities of Prince Rupert, Port Edward, Metlakatla and Lax Kw'alaams.

TOTAL COMMUNITY INVESTMENTS

In 2022, Trigon committed over \$175,000 to local community investments.

In previous years (2020 and 2021), community investments were lower, when many activities were paused as a result of the global pandemic.

The amount that Trigon is able to spend each year is based on our annual throughput volumes. So, the more product we handle, the more we can give back. Any unspent amounts from the annual allocation are also rolled over for use in future years.





FOCUS AREAS

We primarily focus on initiatives in two key areas: Healthy Communities and Vibrant Communities.

1. **Healthy Communities** initiatives address basic needs such as housing, emergency support, food security and nutrition, mental health and literacy.
2. **Vibrant Communities** initiatives are longer-term projects that are helping position all of us for success in our rapidly changing world, through such things as education and skills development, or environmental innovation.

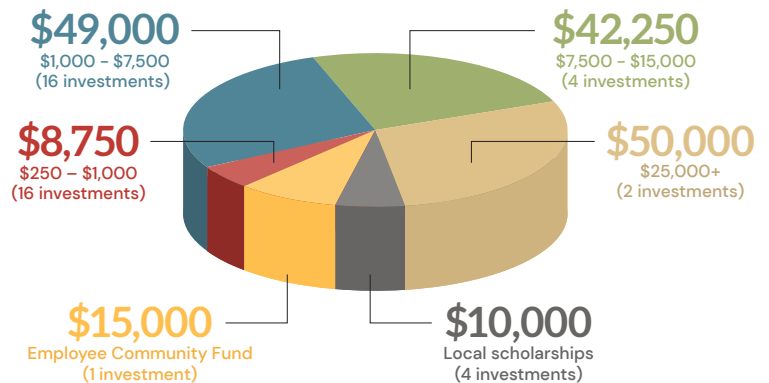

Our community investments vary in size, from providing a few hundred dollars, to much larger-scale initiatives and sometimes multi-year commitments.



Each year, Trigon's Employee Community Fund matches employee donations to local organizations. In 2022, \$15,000 was donated to employee-selected organizations through this program.

In 2022, Trigon made a three-year \$30,000 donation to the Ecotrust's Northwest BC Community Food Initiative, and specifically to the operation of the Sndoyntga Lax Kx'een ada Maxłaxaala Urban Farm, located in Prince Rupert.

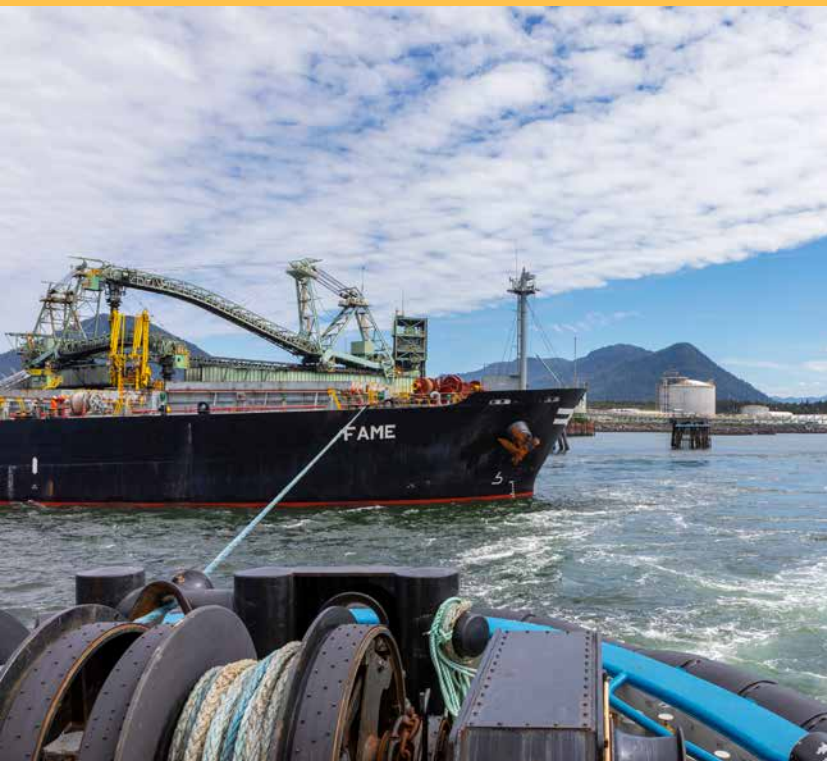

WHO IS TRIGON?

Trigon Pacific Terminals is a multi-commodity export facility and the largest terminal in the Port of Prince Rupert. Formerly known as Ridley Terminals Inc., and in operation since 1984, today the company is privately and partly Indigenous-owned. Trigon and its highly skilled workforce are committed to ongoing excellence in safety, customer service, environmental leadership, and to growth and transformation to support rapidly changing global energy needs.

B2BC PROJECT

In Fall 2022, Trigon broke ground on the first phase of the Berth 2 Beyond Carbon (B2BC) project. Phase one includes the construction of a second berth that will nearly double the terminal's capacity, providing a platform for diversification into the export of Canadian hydrogen-based and other low-carbon exports. B2BC has been funded in part through the federal National Trade Corridors Fund and will be a key link between emerging Canadian producers and Asia-Pacific energy customers.
