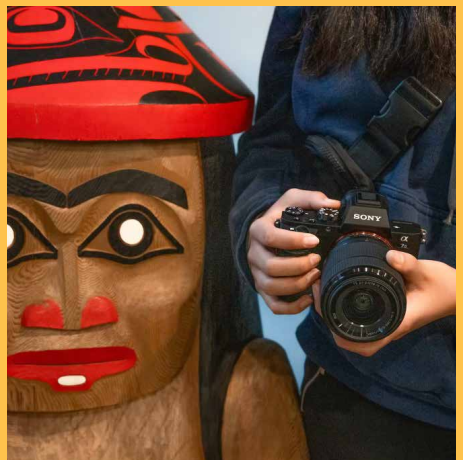
# FOCUS AREAS

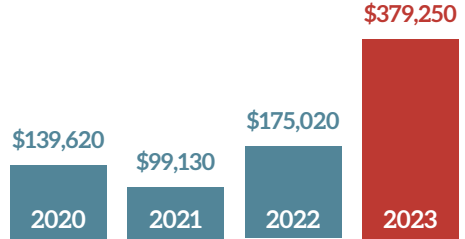
# BY THE NUMBERS

## TOTAL COMMUNITY INVESTMENTS

In 2023, Trigon committed some \$379,000 to local community investments.

This was up significantly from the pandemic period, when many community activities were paused. We also made a number of larger-scale and multi-year commitments in 2023, bringing our investments up to a range that we hope to continue moving forward.

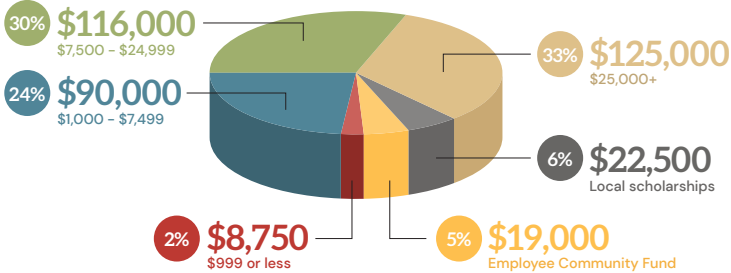
The specific amount that Trigon is able to spend each year is based on our annual throughput volumes. So, the more product we handle, the more we can give back.



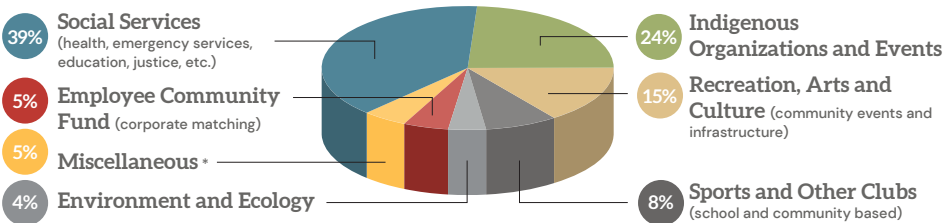
## HOW WE GAVE BACK IN 2023

# FEATURED PARTNERSHIPS

## PRINCE RUPERT & PORT EDWARD FIRE DEPARTMENTS

Our first responders provide lifesaving support to many in our community. In 2023, Trigon made a three-year, \$75,000 commitment to the District of Port Edward to support the purchase of a replacement fire truck. Trigon also provided \$25,000 to the Prince Rupert Fire Department, for a new automated CPR device, which ensures compression consistency for patients experiencing cardiac arrest.

## NATIONAL INDIGENOUS PEOPLE'S DAY

The rich and enduring legacy of Indigenous history and culture is one of the most compelling features of life in Northwest BC, and National Indigenous People's Day is an opportunity for all of us to honour, recognize and celebrate. Trigon was honoured to be the Presenting Sponsor of the 2023 Prince Rupert celebrations, organized by the local school district, with a \$9,000 donation.



## KAIEN ISLAND TRAIL ENHANCEMENT AND RECREATION SOCIETY

Prince Rupert is surrounded by an abundance of natural beauty, and various efforts are underway to enhance the outdoor opportunities for residents and visitors alike. In 2023, Trigon made a three-year \$75,000 commitment to the Kaien Island Trail Enhancement and Recreation Society in support construction of the first phase of a multi-use Cloudberry Trail pathway.



## HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS & ATHLETICS SUPPORT

BC's northwest is home to many exceptional youth, and for many years Trigon has helped local students advance their post-secondary education and training. Each year, five students receive support through the Bernard W. Willers Memorial Scholarships and the Trigon Scholarships, with a total annual value of \$25,000.

Often our young athletes have to travel long distances to compete at higher levels. With this in mind, in 2023, Trigon established a Trigon Teams Sports Fund at Charles Hays Secondary School, which helps fund the full range of team sports activities, while also supporting travel for Provincials-qualifying teams.



# EMPLOYEE COMMUNITY FUND

Each year, Trigon supports our employees who are also giving back to local organizations, by matching employee donations by up to \$50 per employee per pay period.

Beneficiaries of the Employee Community Fund are selected by a Trigon employee committee and in 2023 included such organizations as the Salvation Army, Kaien Anti Poverty Society, the Prince Rupert Hospice, and the Prince Rupert Transition Society. In 2023, the total matching contribution donated to various organizations was \$18,945.

## WHO IS TRIGON?

Trigon Pacific Terminals is a multi-commodity dry and liquid bulk export facility and the largest terminal in the Port of Prince Rupert. With a skilled workforce and proven operational excellence, Trigon a key link between Western Canadian commodity producers and their Asia-Pacific customers.

Trigon is privately owned, with the Lax Kw'alaams and Metlakatla within the ownership group. Trigon is committed to ongoing excellence in safety, customer service, environmental leadership, and to growth and transformation to support rapidly changing global energy needs.

## TERMINAL DIVERSIFICATION

In late 2022, Trigon started construction of the Berth 2 Beyond Carbon (B2BC) second berth project, which will nearly double the terminal's capacity and provide a platform for diversification into the export of low carbon Canadian energy exports. Trigon has also announced the Trigon Pacific LPG project, which will see the redevelopment of a portion of its existing coal facilities for liquid petroleum gas (LPG) exports (also referred to as propane and butane).
