STRONG COMMUNITIES ALONGSIDE A GROWING PORT

These are promising times for the Prince Rupert area. As Canada pursues global trade diversification goals, our port will play an even bigger role in helping achieve national ambitions. At Trigon we're working to turn promise into reality with significant terminal investments.

We're equally committed to doing our part to support healthy and vibrant local communities. In part that means providing good, family-supporting jobs at our terminal and doing business with many fantastic local suppliers. We also give back by setting aside a portion of our revenues to support local events, programs and other initiatives through our Community Investment Fund (CIF).

We've been doing this for a long time, but what's most rewarding for the team at Trigon is that every year we have the opportunity to deepen our relationships and find creative new ways to support the local organizations and volunteers who are making our communities better.

This report describes some of the impacts of Trigon's CIF in 2025. We commend the many community partners we funded for their inspiration and dedication, and we invite prospective new partners to contact us in 2026. We'd love to hear your ideas of how we can build even stronger communities alongside a growing global port.



FOCUS AREAS

We focus our support on two key areas:

1. **Healthy Communities** initiatives address basic needs such as housing, emergency support, food security and nutrition, mental health and physical activity.
2. **Vibrant Communities** initiatives contribute to cultural endeavours and build resiliency through such things as education and skills development, or environmental and recreational innovation.

We support a diverse range of organizations that create meaningful impacts in Prince Rupert, Port Edward, Lax Kw'alaams and Metlakatla, and that deliver benefits to both Indigenous and non-Indigenous residents.

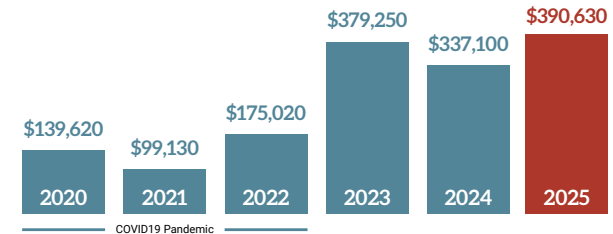


BY THE NUMBERS

In 2025, Trigon made more than \$390,000 in local community investments.

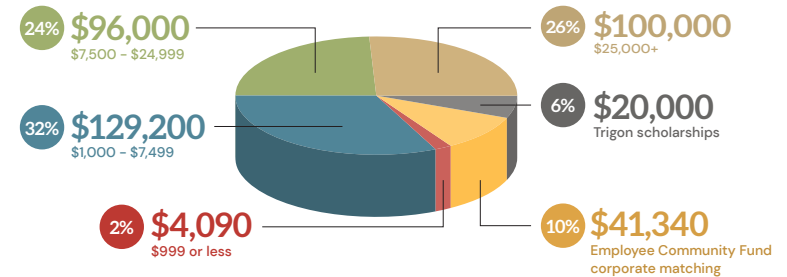
The amount that Trigon invests each year is based on our annual throughput volumes. So, the more product we handle, the more we're able to give back.



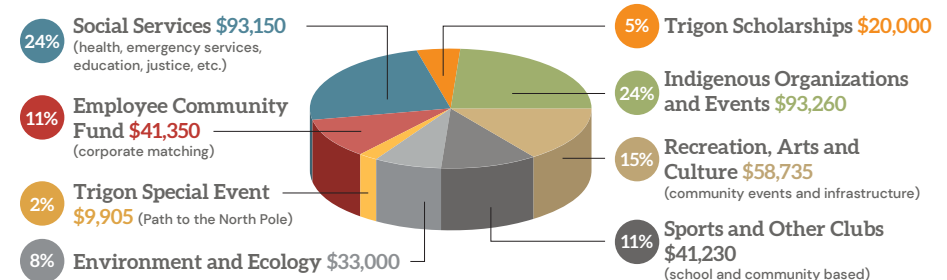
HOW WE GAVE BACK IN 2025

FOSTERING ECOLOGICAL CURIOSITY

Trigon helped fund the North Coast Ecology Centre Society's summer camps, creating hands-on opportunities for youth to connect with our local ecosystems through science-based art, play, and fieldtrips. Participants built tide pools and birds nests, learned the importance of kelp forests, and honed their plant identification skills - all while fostering their curiosity and building their knowledge of the North Coast's unique biodiversity.



HELPING LOCAL ATHLETES BRING HOME GOLD

Trigon's support for the Northern Indigenous Basketball Association helped send three teams - and more than 30 local youth athletes - to the Junior All Native Tournament in Kelowna in March. The under-13 boys team took first place in the highest-tier gold division, bringing the prestigious trophy and banner home to Prince Rupert.



PRINCE RUPERT'S PATH TO THE NORTH POLE

Trigon's second annual Path to the North Pole event enjoyed expanded partner support in 2025. Launched in partnership with the Kaien Trail Society and the Lester Centre of the Arts, additional support for the event came from B&B Heavy Civil Construction and Pacific Northwest Electric this year - enabling us to work towards a

permanent electricity source on the first phase of the Cloudberry Trail. The Path to the North Pole event includes a festive light display, hot cocoa with Santa, and a family-friendly holiday film.



ENRICHING LOCAL LEARNING IN DIVERSE WAYS

Prince Rupert and Port Edward public schools provide formative experiences and set students up to realize career and other life goals whether here in our local region or far afield.

Trigon provides extensive support to School District 52 - \$63,000 in 2025 - helping to enrich diverse aspects of the student experience:

- **Sports:** Offset provincial-competition travel costs and funded sports equipment purchases for student athletes at Charles Hays Secondary School (CHSS) through the Trigon Team Sports Fund.
- **Extra-Curricular Activities:** Helped the CHSS Drama Club participate in the BC National Theatre School Drama Festival in New Westminster, bought new guitars for the Prince Rupert Middle School, and covered travel costs for middle school musicians taking part in the ConBrio Music Festival in Sun Peaks.
- **Fueling Minds:** Supported the Breakfast Club of Canada's local school programming as well as the local Rotary Club's Apples in Schools program - both of which help prevent hunger from getting in the way of learning.
- **Scholarships:** Continued our long-standing Trigon Scholarship program, which provides \$5,000 per student to help with the cost of post-secondary studies at university, college or in trades training.¹

We also created a plan in late 2025 - in partnership with the school district and Coast Mountain College - to revive a previously funded trades training program, which will mean an even richer range of opportunities for local students in 2026.

1. One of these five scholarships is awarded to a student in Terrace, in recognition of the fact that many of Trigon's employees live in that community.



EMPLOYEE COMMUNITY FUND

We support our team, they support others and together we are building stronger, healthier communities and enabling others to do the same.

Each year, Trigon amplifies our employees' own giving to local organizations by providing matching funds of up to \$50 per employee per pay period.

Beneficiaries of the Employee Community Fund are selected by a Trigon employee committee and included such organizations as Kaien Anti-Poverty Society, North Coast Transition Society, and the Salvation Army. In 2025, a total of \$41,350 in corporate matching was directed to the Employee Community Fund.

TERMINAL DIVERSIFICATION

Trigon has several projects underway aimed at diversifying our operations, keeping up with global trends in commodity demand, and ensuring the long-term viability of our business. Highlights in 2025 included:

- Marine construction for our Berth 2 Beyond Carbon was largely completed, and large pre-cast platform components installed. Installation of shiploading equipment is set to begin in 2026. This project attracted a \$75 million grant from the National Trade Corridors Fund.
- We signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Ulsan Free Economic Zone Authority in South Korea, committing to collaborate to create a hydrogen-as-ammonia export supply chain.
- Our owners greenlighted the Trigon Pacific LPG Project. Subject to legal and regulatory approvals, this \$750 million investment will add 2.5 million tonnes per year of much needed, open-access export capacity for this important commodity.
- We continued to advance planning for land-based storage and handling infrastructure for the new and more diverse commodities we anticipate moving in the future.



In 2025, and for the third year in a row, Trigon achieved top marks in the Green Marine environmental certification program.
